Presenting a Complex Hybrid Program

Technology Infrastructure

ICC Sydney adhered to strict venue protocols as outlined in its venue specific COVID-19 Safety Plan as well as working within its established 'EventSafe' operating protocols in place to support the Australian Governance Summit to proceed in a COVID safe environment whilst meeting the current NSW Government regulation of one person per two square metres.
