MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

It is the responsibility of all persons conducting a business or undertaking (PCBUs) and their staff to ensure that Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) legislation and safe work practices are followed to ensure, as far as reasonably practicable, the health and safety of all persons that may be affected by the activity.

Naked flames must be part of the exhibitor's product range and essential for the product demonstration.

Naked flames may not be used for decorative purposes in exhibitions.

Flammable items such as brochures must not be within close proximity to any naked flame.

Flammable items cannot be located on a stand with a ceiling of any kind.

Where feasible, all candles should be located within an appropriate container to capture melting wax. Incense burning should be in a container to catch any falling ash.

Naked flames and hot surfaces must be located in such a manner that they are clear of all flammable surfaces and cannot be knocked over.

Signage advising persons of a hot surface is to be displayed adjacent to any fire place or hot surface.

Any fire place must be compliant with relevant standards.

Fire places must be operated as per the manufacturer's instructions.

All fuel must be transported, handled and stored as per the relevant Safety Data Sheet. Under no circumstances may fuel be stored on site. Is the fuel deemed hazardous? If so complete the Hazardous Chemicals Permit Form. If the fuel is LPG, refer to the LPG guidelines.

Naked flames must be monitored at all times; under no circumstances can a stand be unattended whilst a naked flame is lit.

All naked flames must be extinguished 15 minutes before show close each day.

An appropriate fire extinguisher must be located on the stand. The staff on the stand must be trained on the correct operation of the fire extinguisher.

All council or other legislative permit requirements are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Firing point must not be less than 250 metres from a dangerous goods store including LPG storage.

ICC Sydney may limit the number of naked flames at its discretion.
